# Karnataka allows asymptomatic Covid-19 positive students to attend KCET

**New Delhi** : Even as the state records an increase in coronavirus cases, the Karnataka government Tuesday announced that candidates who have tested positive for Covid-19 but are asymptomatic will be permitted to attend the Karnataka Common Entrance Test (KCET) 2020, scheduled to be held on July 30 and 31. Over 1.94 lakh candidates have enrolled for the entrance test.

Confirming the same, Deputy Chief Minister C N Ashwathnarayan said, "KCET 2020 will take place as scheduled on July 30 and 31 adhering to all guidelines issued by the Health Department. All Deputy Commissioners have been directed to arrange exclusive exam centres and rooms for candidates who are asymptomatic and have tested positive for Covid-19."

Reiterating that the state government will ensure safety of candidates and invigilators attending the exam, he said ambulances will be arranged for those at Covid Care Centres for pick-up and drop facilities.

Further, Ashwathnarayan, who is also in charge of the Higher Education Department said students who are travelling from other states to take the entrance exam will be exempted from quarantine rules. "As many as 1871 candidates from outside the state are expected to appear for the test. They will be exempted from home quarantine norms and will be allowed to stay in Karnataka for 96 hours," he added.

The examinations were taken by the government despite demands from several student organisations and leaders citing a potential risk due to the ongoing pandemic situation.

"The situation now in the state is alarming and the government asking us to attend the exams amid this pandemic is totally non-acceptable. The situation has worsened from how it was when the final PU exam was conducted. I was expecting that the Minister will announce another date for KCET today," Divya Gowda, a candidate said.

However, Minister Ashwathnarayan said the decision to conduct the examination as planned was taken in the "best interest of our students." He added that the higher education of the students was not something to be compromised. "There's no need to worry, Karnataka has been successful in conducting SSLC and PU exams. All measures taken then and more will be strictly followed at each centre to ensure KCET 2020 is conducted without any worries," he said.

While candidates will attend Biology and Mathematics papers on July 30, they will answer Physics and Chemistry papers on July 31. The pen-and-paper examination is conducted by the Karnataka Examinations Authority, which is also in charge of allocating seats to various colleges to the students.

Meanwhile, 30 students will travel from other countries to the state to take the exam. They (overseas candidates) have been intimated about the same long back and have been given enough and more time to be at their respective locations to take the entrance test," the minister said.

Of the total 1,94,356 candidates writing the exam in 497 exam centres across the state, 40,200 are from Bengaluru alone. As many as 83 exam centres are in the capital city.

Ashutosh said the body would be taken to Gulaga Ghat Chowk at 4 pm, where the last rites would be performed.

He also requested the public to pay their respects from home due to the coronavirus pandemic. "Keeping in mind the coronavirus pandemic, I request you to follow rules and regulations announced by the administration and pay your tributes to my father from your own houses. This will help in maintaining the social distancing as well," Ashutosh tweeted.

"Eradication of Covid-19 is the priority of the Maharashtra government, but some people think constructing a temple will help in its mitigation," Pawar said.

Echoing Pawar, Maharashtra minister and Maharashtra Congress president Balasaheb Thorat alleged the BJP was using the issue to divert attention from the Union government's failure to take effective measures to combat Covid-19.

Dismissing reports of a rift over the issue, Raut said, "Sharad Pawar has not criticised the creation of the Ram Mandir. I have heard his statement. When the Supreme Court gives its judgement, Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi, Sharad Pawar welcomed it. He (Pawar) has expressed his opinion on what should be the priority in the current Covid-19 situation.

"This is a government of three parties, and nowhere in the MVA's formation, it is written we have to have consensus on an issue. As a government, it has to be run with unanimity to implement the programmes for the people as per the common minimum programme.

Raut said there are no issues within MVA over Thackeray's plan to visit Ayodhya. "This is not a political or a religious issue but a matter of national pride. It is being implemented after the Supreme Court's orders. The common minimum programme will remain our guiding light to run the government. Whether to go to Ayodhya or not is not an agenda of the government," he said.

The court also requested the speaker to defer any action against Pilot and legislators in his camp till then.

If the high court decides to disqualify Pilot and members of his camp, it will have a direct bearing on the numbers in the Rajasthan assembly.

The disqualification will bring down the majority mark in the assembly—101 in the 200-member house making it easier for chief minister Gehlot to win a floor test. Gehlot has claimed he has the support of more than 100 members of legislative assembly (MLAs) and Pilot is being backed by 18 legislators.

The disqualification notices to Pilot and the MLAs were served after the Congress party complained to Rajasthan assembly speaker Joshi that they defied a whip to attend two CLP meetings on July 13 and July 14.

After he gave the meetings a slip, Pilot was sacked as the Rajasthan deputy chief minister and the president of the state Congress unit as he rebelled against Gehlot.

## Central team flags poor..

Dr. Neeraj Nischal of New Delhi-based All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) said a strict hospital infection control policy is the top priority and doctors and paramedical staff need to undergo exhaustive training to implement it.

"The policy implementation will ensure that doctors and healthcare workers will work without any fear and hesitation amid the spread of the viral outbreak. All healthcare personnel will perform better, if they are made to feel safe," said Dr. Nischal.

The delegates have taken strong exception to the unfettered movement of attendants in the Covid-19 facility. "The wards are prohibited areas. The attendants' unrestricted movement makes them potential spreaders," Dr. Nischal said during the meeting, while efforts are on to boost the morale of the hospital's healthcare staff.

Dr. Nischal is believed to have advocated for a mechanism to train doctors and healthcare workers in infection control in Bihar's medical colleges that can function as nodal centres.

The Central team members reinforced the concept of aggressive daily testing while citing that Bihar has been lagging behind in optimal utilisation of its test potential.

"Bihar needs to conduct around 18,000 daily tests, which must be further increased. Test-contain-treat should be the simple three-step formula to treat Covid-19 patients. An uptick in aggressive daily testing control is the need of the hour, as the state had to cope with a massive influx of migrant population amid the easing of nationwide lockdown restrictions," said Dr. Nischal, who also interacted with civil surgeons and others involved in the bid to contain the contagion, in the presence of Manoj Kumar, executive director, Bihar State Health Society (BSHS).
